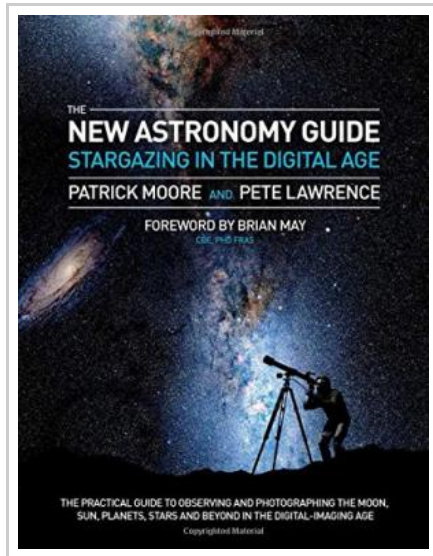




Stargazing: The Digital Astronomer (Paperback)
