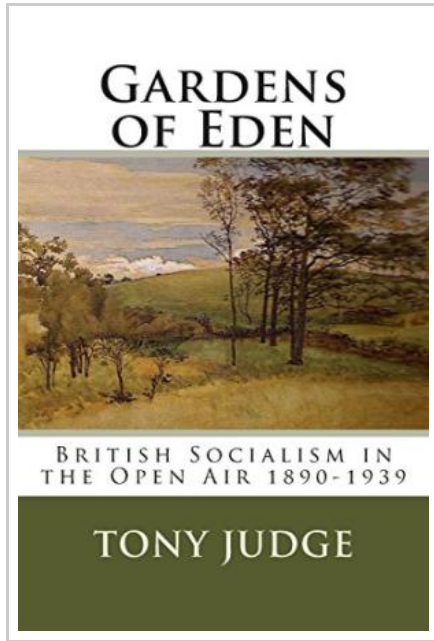




Gardens of Eden: British Socialism in the Open Air 1890-1939 (Paperback)
