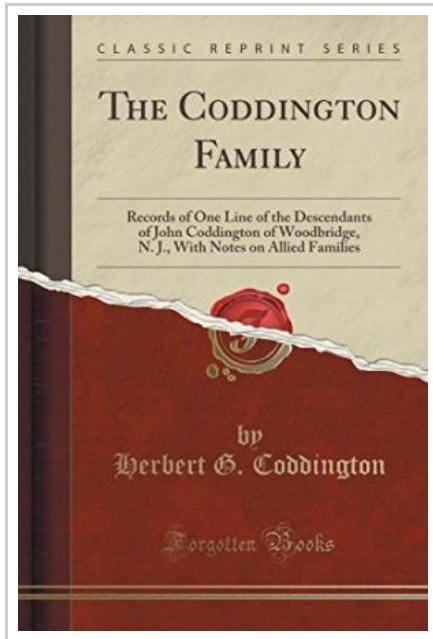

It is found in various forms (Codington, Codinton, Codyngton, Coddington, De Codyngton, etc.), in the English records as far back as 1200. The component parts of this name (Codrington) are all Saxon, viz., Cod, a wallet or husk of any grain; ring, a ring; and ton, a town; but from these with the help even of the most fanciful imagination we can collect nothing satisfactory respecting its etymology. - Playfair's British Family Antiquity, vol. 6, p. 801. Origin of the Family. From Philip, younger son of David de Malpas, descends the famous knightly family of the Egertons, who took the name from the place of their residence, as others of this family from Cotgrave, Overton, Codington, Golborn, places where they lived. - (Britannia, by Wm.
